#### MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

#### KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

The DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, a government entity mandated by law, particularly B.P. 232, otherwise known as the "Education Act of 1982", as amended by Republic Act No. 9155, otherwise known as "Governance of Basic Education Act of 2001", with office address at DepEd Complex, Meralco Avenue, Pasig City, represented herein by its Secretary, LEONOR MAGTOLIS BRIONES, hereinafter referred to as "DepED";

-and-

The AFFILIATED NETWORK FOR SOCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY IN EAST ASIA AND THE PACIFIC, with principal office at 3<sup>rd</sup>Floor, Mansi Building, 337 Katipunan Avenue, Quezon City, represented by the Executive Director, REDEMPTO S. PARAFINA, hereinafter referred to as the "ANSA":

#### WITNESSETH: That:

WHEREAS, DepEd aims to protect and promote the right of every Filipino to quality, equitable, culture-based and complete basic education.

WHEREAS, ANSA is a non-stock, non-profit corporation registered under Philippine law which enables constructive engagement between citizens and government for the monitoring of public resources, based on assertion of rights and toward effective service delivery and promotion of welfare.

WHEREAS, ANSA has spearheaded CheckMySchool (CMS) as a participatory monitoring initiative and demonstrated effective processes of engagement to improve the condition of public school services.

WHEREAS, both parties recognize the value of CMS in advancing transparency, accountability and citizen participation in public schools, and agree to enter into a partnership to strengthen school monitoring through CMS;

WHEREAS, both parties recognize and ensure compliance with Republic Act No. 10173, or the "Data Privacy Act of 2012" and "Freedom of Information Order under E.O. No. 2, S, 2018"

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the above premises, the PARTIES agree on the following terms and conditions as follows:

# Section 1 - Description of the Project

CMS is a participatory monitoring initiative for the education sector in the Philippines. It envisions to continuously improve the quality of public education services in the Philippines by empowering Filipino citizens to mobilize and engage local and national governments and address issues in schools through transparency and social accountability.

CMSis run by a secretariat with networking, research-knowledge-learning, communications, and sustainability functions. Its local network has area coordinators who mobilize volunteers and directly interact with school stakeholders. Its current funding donor is the Open Society Foundation through the World Banks' Global Partnership for Social Accountability.

In 2010 and 2012, ANSA signed a Memorandum of Agreement with the DepEd, which formalized the department's endorsement and support for the CMS project

# Section 2 - Responsibilities of the Parties

# 2.1 The DepED shall

- Recognize ANSA as partner organization with CMS as a partnership initiative in 2.11 promoting transparency, accountability and participation in school based management
- Assign the Planning Service and the Bureau of Human Resource and 2.1.2 Organizational Development's School Effectiveness Division (SED) as the main contact points for the CMS activities:
- Endorse CMS Project and the assigned volunteers subject to pertinent laws, rules 2 1 3 and regulations.

There shall be no employer-employee relationship with ANSA and its assigned volunteers. Neither shall the employees, personnel, staff employed by ANSA in connection with the implementation of the CMS be considered as employees of DepEd.

DepEd shall not pay salary or any remuneration to said volunteers and personnel of ANSA

- Receive CMS reports and convene a meeting among CMS and concerned offices 2.1.4 that can address the reported issues.
- DepEd will issue a memorandum relevant to the transparency and social 2.1.5 accountability advocacies of CMS

#### 2.2 The ANSA shall

- Spearhead the implementation of the CMS project that complements existing 2.2.1 DepEd's process that promotes transparency, accountability, and participation in school based management
- 2.2.2 Coordinate closely with DepEd, through the Planning Service, the Bureau of Human Resource and Organizational Development's School Effectiveness Division (SED), in implementing the activities:
- 2.2.3 Mobilize and manage the participation of local coordinators and school volunteers coming from local and national partner civil society organizations, and concerned citizens.
- 2.2.4 Track the progress of CMS Project:
- Report results to and discuss recommendations with DepEd policymakers and the 225 public;
- 2.2.6 Co-organize the public presentation and other events promoting the transparency and social accountability advocacies of CMS

# Section 3 - Scope of the Project Beneficiaries

The project primarily benefits the public schools and their immediate stakeholders, namely the learners, the parents, the teachers, and administrators. CheckMySchool provides an additional avenue for the immediate stakeholders of schools to give feedback on school issues, or voice concerns or queries. Additionally, CMS volunteers may also provide local DepEd offices with assistance in monitoring key issues and validate existing data or reports. CMS volunteers also assist in ensuring that the identified solutions for the school issues are monitored and properly implemented. Data gathered by volunteers, especially in the types of school issues documented, and their experience with engaging the local communities and local DepEd offices may also provide useful insights for DepEd policy research and school needs assessment.

Under current project capacity, CMS can operate and assist up to 1000 public schools in DepEd Divisions where the program has active area coordinators and volunteers. Attached in Annex 1 is a list of provinces covered by CMS in 2017, CheckMySchool is also seeking to expand its operations to schools in additional regions; especially in the immediate vicinity of areas already covered.

# Section 4 - Project Cost

ANSA, through the OSF grant, assumes all the costs of the project activities. The costs relevant to this agreement include the following:

Trainings of coordinators (30 coordinators/training x 2)	PHP 600,000
Area coordinators' local operations (1,000 schools)	PHP 1,000,000
Project Assessment (30 participants/event x 2)	PHP 600,000
Events (100 participants max)	PHP 150,000

#### Section 5 - Non-Waiver

The failure of either party to enforce any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a waiver or limitation of that party's right to subsequently enforce and compel strict compliance with every provision of this Agreement.

### Section 6 - Severability Clause

If any provision of this Agreement is found by any court or administrative body to be invalid and enforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such provision shall not affect the other provisions of this Agreement, and all provisions not affected by such invalidity or unenforceability shall remain in full force and effect.

# Section 7- Effectivity and Termination

In the event that facts and circumstances arise or are discovered which render this agreement disadvantageous to the government or is not effectively reliving its purpose, the PARTIES agree to immediately review the same or at the option of any PARTY, with a thirty (30) day prior notice to the other PARTY.

# Section 8- Amendment

This Agreement shall not be altered, modified, supplemented or amended except by a written instrument duly signed by the parties hereto.

# Section 9- Assignment

No party may assign or transfer any right or obligation under this Agreement, or any contract supplementary hereto, to a third party, without the prior written consent of the other party. The provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon and accrue to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.

## Section 10 - Governing Law

This Agreement shall be construed under and governed by the laws of the Republic of the Philippines.

# Section 11 - Warranty

The parties herein warrant that they have the capacity, power and requisite authorization to enter into this Agreement
