AN ORDER PROVIDING RESTRICTIONS AND OTHER PROTOCOLS UNDER THE MODIFIED ENHANCED COMMUNITY QUARANTINE (MECQ) STATUS IN THE PROVINCE OF AKLAN AND ENJOINING STRICT OBSERVANCE AND IMPLEMENTATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the Province of Aklan is classified under General Community Quarantine with Heightened Restrictions for the period of August 1 to 15, 2021 under IATF Resolution 130-A;

WHEREAS, based on the high percentage of average daily attack rate of COVID-19 and health care utilization in the province as reported by the Department of Health - Center for Health Development in Western Visayas, the Province of Aklan is already considered as "HIGH RISK" under the Risk Classification Matrix of the Department of Health (DOH) and should be under Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ);

WHEREAS, in order to arrest the increasing trend of confirmed COVID-19 cases and prevent the total collapse of the local health system of Aklan, the Provincial Inter-Agency Task Force on COVID-19 together with the League of Municipalities of the Philippines-Aklan Chapter are compelled to appeal to the National Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) to place the Province of Aklan under MECQ;

WHEREAS, on August 1, 2021 the National Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF-EID), approved and placed the Province of Aklan under the status of Modified Enhanced Community Quarantine (MECQ) as per IATF Resolution No. 130-D Series of 2021, effective August 1 to 15, 2021;

NOW THEREFORE, I, FLORENCIO T. MIRAFLORES, by virtue of the power vested in me by law, do hereby ORDER the observance and strict implementation of the following, to wit:

SECTION 1. OPERATIONS OF BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS, PERSONS OR ACTIVITIES.

As per the Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Memorandum Circular No. 21-28, Series of 2021, the following are the allowable on-site operational or venue/seating capacity of business establishments, persons or activities under MECQ:

A. Category I (100% allowed)

1. Public and private hospitals;

2. Health emergency and frontline services, including those provided by dialysis centers, chemotherapy centers, HMOs, health insurance providers, disaster risk reduction management officers, and public safety officers and the like;
3. Industries involved in agriculture (crops, fruits, vegetables, livestock and poultry), forestry, fishery, and such other components of the food value chain and their workers, including farmers and fisher folks;
4. Logistics service providers (delivery and courier services, cargo handling; warehousing; trucking; freight forwarding; shipping port and terminal operators);
5. Essential and priority construction projects, whether public or private, and small scale construction projects such as those for housing or residential, in accordance with the guidelines issued by the Department of Public Works and Highways;
6. Companies that manufacture, distribute and/or supply equipment or products necessary to perform construction or maintenance works, such as cement and steel, or spare parts;
7. Essential retail trade and service establishments such as public markets, supermarkets, grocery stores, convenience stores, pharmacies or drug stores, hardware, office supplies, bicycle shops, laundry shops, and water refilling stations;
8. Public and private financial service providers involved in the distribution of government grants and amelioration subsidies;
9. Business process outsourcing establishments (BPOs) and export-oriented businesses, including mining and quarrying activities;
10. Public transport providers and operators subject to the Department of Transportation (DOTr) guidelines;
11. Media establishments and their total permanent staff complement, inclusive of reporters and other field employees;
12. Dental, rehabilitation, optometry and other medical clinics for the treatment of illness or injuries. Provided, that there is strict observance of infection prevention and control protocols. Provided further, that the wearing of full Personal Protective Equipment (PPEs) by dentists and attendants shall be mandatory. Provided finally, that home service therapy for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) shall be allowed;
13. Veterinary Clinics;
14. Banks, money transfer services, including pawnshops only insofar as performing money transfer functions, microfinance institutions, and credit cooperatives, including their armored vehicle services, if any;
15. Water supply and janitorial/sanitation services and facilities, including waste disposal services as well as property management and building utility services;
16. Energy sector (oil, gas, and power companies), their third-party contractors and service providers, including employees involved in

electric transmission and distribution, electric power plant and line maintenance, electricity market and retail suppliers, as well as those involved in the exploration, operations, trading and delivery of coal, oil, crude or petroleum and by-products (gasoline, diesel, liquefied petroleum gas, jet oil, kerosene, lubricants), including gasoline stations, refineries and depots or any kind of fuel used to produce electricity;

17. Telecommunications companies, internet service providers, cable television providers, including those who perform indirect services such as the technical, sales, and other support personnel, as well as the employees of their third-party contractors doing sales, installation, maintenance and repair works;
18. Airline and aircraft maintenance, pilots and crew, and employees of aviation schools for purposes of the pilot's recurrent training for flight proficiency and type rating using simulator facilities; and ship captains and crew, including shipyard operations and repair;
19. Funeral and embalming services;
20. Security personnel licensed by the PNP-Supervisory Office for Security and Investigation Agencies;
21. Printing establishments authorized by the Bureau of Internal Revenue and other government agencies to print accountable forms and other security documents;
22. Establishments engaged in repair and maintenance of machinery and equipment, for household and essential permitted establishments;
23. Establishments engaged in repair and maintenance of motorized and non-motorized vehicles, including the sale of spare parts;
24. Lawyers who will provide legal representation necessary to protect rights of persons as well as legal services for permitted establishments, and law firms;
25. All other establishments, to the extent necessary for the buying and selling of consumer goods or services via the internet.

B. Category II (50% only is allowed)

1. Office Administrative and Office Support (such as photocopying, billing, and record keeping services);
2. Other financial services (e.g., money exchange, insurance, reinsurance, lending companies, and non-compulsory pending funding);
3. Architecture and Engineering Activities, technical Testing and Analysis;
4. Computer programming (such as writing, modifying, testing and supporting software, planning and designing computer systems), information services activities (such as data processing and hosting activities) and other related activities;

5. Publishing and printing services (such as printing of newspapers, magazines, and other periodicals, books, brochures, manuscripts, posters, maps, atlases, advertising catalogue, prospectuses, etc; printing directly onto textiles, plastic, glass, metal wood, and ceramics);
6. Wholesale and retail trade of motor vehicles, motorcycles and bicycles, including their parts and components;
7. Travel agencies, tour operators, reservation service and related activities;
8. Pet grooming services;
9. Non-leisure whole sale and retail establishments (mall-based or otherwise) such as:
 - a. Mall-based government frontline services
 - b. Clothing and accessories
 - c. Bookstores and school office supplies stores
 - d. Baby or infant care supplies stores
 - e. Pet shops, pet food and pet care supplies
 - f. IT, communications, and electronic equipment
 - g. Flower, jewelry, novelty, antique, perfume shops
 - h. Toy store (playgrounds and amusement area closed)
 - i. Music stores
 - j. Art gallery (selling only)
 - k. Firearms and ammunition trading establishment
10. Driving Schools (subject to DOTr guidelines);
11. Review Centers;
12. Outdoor sports, courts or venues
 - a. Non-contact sports courts or venue or activities, such as, but not limited to, walking, jogging, and running; golf, tennis and badminton, equestrian, range shooting, archery, and Philippine Sports Commission (PSC) authorized venues and sanctioned activities for training purposes, including National Golf Association of the Philippines (NGAP) trainings

EXCEPT the following which are not allowed

1. Contact sports, scrimmages, games or activities
2. Indoor sports, courts or venues, fitness studios, gyms or other indoor leisure centers or facilities, and swimming pools.

C. Category III – Not Allowed

1. Indoor visitor or tourist attractions, libraries, archives, museums, galleries, cultural shows and exhibits;
2. Outdoor tourist attractions;

3. No indoor and outdoor dining shall be allowed except takeout and delivery services.
4. Meetings, incentives, conventions and exhibitions;
5. Social events in eligible venue establishments;
6. Beauty salons, barbershops, beauty parlors and nail spas;
7. Other personal care services which include make up salons, medical aesthetic clinics, cosmetic or derma clinics, reflexology, aesthetics, wellness and holistic centers and other similar establishments, acupunctures, and electrocautery establishments and massage therapy, including sports therapy establishments including establishments providing tanning services, body piercing, tattooing and similar services.

D. Category IV – The following are likewise Not Allowed

1. Cinemas, amusement parks or theme parks
2. Casinos, Lottery and betting shops, and other gaming establishments
3. Horse racing
4. Recreational venues such as internet cafes, billiard halls, amusement arcades, bowling alleys and similar venues
5. Cockfighting and operation of cockpits including e-sabong
6. Entertainment venues with live performances such as Karaoke bars, bars, clubs, concert halls and theaters
7. Fairs/programs, kid amusement industries such as playground, playroom and kiddie rides.

SECTION 2. GUIDELINES ON THE ENTRY OF PERSONS IN THE PROVINCE OF AKLAN:

- A. The following persons are allowed entry into the Province of Aklan during the period of MECQ:
 1. Authorized Persons Outside Residence as provided for under Section 7(2)(a) of the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines, as amended¹
 2. Repatriated OFWs or returning OFs of Aklan who have been issued a DOH/BOQ quarantine certificate

¹ Section 7(2)(a) of the Omnibus Guidelines on the Implementation of Community Quarantine in the Philippines, as amended as of May 20, 2021 identifies the following as Authorized Persons Outside Residence (APORs): (1) health and emergency frontline services and uniformed personnel, (2) government officials and employees on official travel, (3) duly-authorized humanitarian assistance actors (HAAs), especially those transporting medical supplies and laboratory specimens related to COVID-19, and other relief and humanitarian assistance, (4) persons traveling for medical or humanitarian reasons, (5) persons going to and from the airport, (6) anyone crossing zones for work or business permitted in the zone of destination, or activities as may be authorized by the IATF, and going back home, and (7) public utility vehicle operators.

3. Returning Aklanons who have been issued a Notice of Coordination/Acceptance from their Municipality of Destination by the Office of the Mayor

Provided they comply with the QR Code requirements of the Province of Aklan under Section 7 of this EO.

- B. The following persons are allowed entry into the Province of Aklan without need of presenting a Negative RT-PCR Test Result, to wit:
 1. Travellers coming from Western Visayas areas whose point of destination is mainland Aklan only;
 2. Authorized Persons Outside Residence (APORs) as defined under Resolution No. 98-A coming from Western Visayas (APOR-WV) only and entering the Island of Boracay on Official Business, provided that he/she must possess a Travel Order, Travel Itinerary and Government Issued ID;
 3. Drivers, helpers of delivery trucks and vans, Provided that they have registered to the "QR Code System" of the Province before boarding; and if their final point of destination is outside of Aklan or passing through Aklan in addition to the QR Code of the Province of Aklan, they have to register to the S-Pass System prior to travel from the LGU of their final destination;
 4. Passing through travellers with Aklan OHDC for Travellers QR Code and S-Pass Travel Coordination Permit (TCP) issued by the LGU of destination in Western Visayas only

SECTION 3. MOVEMENT OF PERSONS WITHIN THE PROVINCE OF AKLAN.

- A. The movement of all persons shall be limited to accessing goods and services from permitted establishments for work, in such establishments, or for such other activities allowed under Section 1, hereof.
- B. The following persons are required to remain in their residence at all times:
 - a. Persons below eighteen (18) years old;
 - b. Those who are over sixty five (65) years old;
 - c. Those with immunodeficiency, comorbidity or other health risks;
 - d. Pregnant women

EXCEPT those who go out of their residences for essential goods and services and for health/medical reasons subject to the protocols of the municipality/barangay of their residence like securing quarantine/travel pass.

- C. Pedal bikers for leisure and other wellness activities shall limit themselves within the municipality where they are residents except those that uses bicycles as their means of transportation in going to and coming from work or in their pursuit of trade or profession.

SECTION 4. CURFEW HOURS. A curfew from 8:00PM to 4:00AM is hereby imposed in the entire Province of Aklan from August 1, 2021 until August 31, 2021, unless shortened or extended upon recommendation of the Provincial IATF or the DOH, as the case may be.

All local government units (LGUs) in this Province are hereby enjoined to implement the curfew hours provided herein by enacting an Ordinance by providing penalties thereof.

The following persons shall be exempted from the coverage of the curfew hours during their tour of duty and going to and coming from their place of work provided they can present proof relative thereto, to wit:

1. Those providing Medical Services:

- a) All DOH officials and staff
- b) All health and services personnel station at LGU health facilities
- c) All Philippine Red Cross vehicles bearing the Red Cross Logo and staff with Red Cross IDs
- d) Core staff from the world Health Organization (WHO) and regional offices
- e) Doctors and health workers, and their drivers
- f) Hospital staff, and employees including janitorial services
- g) Medical professionals and other employees
- h) Private care giver

2. Those personnel in the Funeral Service Industry:

- a) Employees
- b) Immediate family of deceased

3. Emergency Responders:

- a) Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP), including volunteer fire fighters
- b) Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (PDRRMO), including disaster risk reduction personnel, whether job order, plantilla, or volunteer personnel
- c) Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Provincial Social Welfare Development Office (PSWDO), and Municipal Social Welfare Development Office (MSWDO)
- d) Barangay Health Emergency Response Teams (BHERTs)
- e) LGU Officials

4. Security Services

- a) Law enforcement personnel (PNP, AFP, BJMP, NBI, OTS, BOC, BI and PPA)
- b) Company security officers and security guards
- c) Force multipliers (Barangay Officials, Barangay Tanods)

5. Delivery Personnel (maximum 3 including the Driver) of food and food products, including their raw materials, medicines and medical supplies, including empty trucks or vans whether going to and from as long as within the Island of Panay, and subject to thermal scanning procedures.

SECTION 5. LIQUOR BAN. The selling, dispensing, transporting and drinking in public of liquor or alcoholic beverages or any alcoholic drink containing a specific percentage of alcohol by volume or weight which may be in the form of whisky, brandy, gin, rum cordial, liquor, cocktail, wine, champagne, vermouth, basi, tuba, saki, beer, ale stout and others are prohibited.

SECTION 6. MASS GATHERING. Defined. A congregation of five (5) or more persons is considered a mass gathering.

Gatherings outside of residences shall be prohibited. Gatherings at residences with any person outside of one's immediate household shall likewise be prohibited. However, gatherings that are essential for the provision of health services, government services, or humanitarian activities authorized by the appropriate government agency or instrumentality shall be allowed.

Religious gatherings shall be allowed up to thirty percent (30%) of the venue capacity.

Gatherings for necrological services, wakes, inurnment, funerals for those who died of causes other than COVID-19 shall be allowed, provided that the same shall be limited to immediate family members, upon satisfactory proof of their relationship with the deceased and with full compliance with the prescribed minimum public health standards for the duration of the activity.

SECTION 7. QR CODE REQUIREMENT. All persons entering the Province of Aklan as provided in this Order shall register in the QR Code System developed by the Province and may be accessed in the following manner:

Multiple Traveller documents can be sent in one email. Just include a listing of the names. Note: Please submit your documents at least twelve (12) hours or more before your travel to Aklan to avoid delays. RT-PCR results are verified with the laboratories. Traveller with falsified RT-PCR Result shall be criminally prosecuted.

5. Wait for the email response (successful or unsuccessful) of the Final Validator. The Validation Team processes the QR Code within an hour from receipt of email and usually responds within an hour. If you have not received any response within two (2) hours, please send another follow up email.
6. If processing is unsuccessful, an email will be sent to you requesting for additional requirements or clarification. Please immediately comply with this to avoid delays in the QR Code release.
7. If processing is successful, a copy of Health Declaration Card with QR Code will be sent back through email. Have a printed or digital copy. The QR Code will be used in the ports of entry (land, air, sea).

D. For APOR-WV going to Boracay Island.

1. Access <https://www.touristboracay.com/> and choose Aklan.
2. Fill out required fields and click submit. Make sure that the correct visitor type is selected (APOR-WV).
3. Save or print a copy of the OHDC.
4. For APOR-WV present the following to the port of entry personnel:
 - a. Copy of the OHDC with APOR-WV QR Code
 - b. Valid IDs issued by their respective government agency
 - c. Original or Certified true copy of Travel Order/Travel Authority issued by the Department Secretary or his/her designated official
 - d. Travel Itinerary/Travel details

E. For Aklanon Travellers passing through LGUs or ports of entry that require S-PASS should secure:

1. An OHDC for Travellers QR Code (refer to Section 7 (A) above)
2. An S-PASS TCP through the following:
 - a. Access <https://s-pass.ph/> in any browser and click "Create an Account"
 - b. Complete the Member Registration process
 - c. After getting the account credentials, go back to the homepage of <https://s-pass.ph/> and login using your mobile phone number (without the "0") and your password
 - d. Click on "Are you travelling?" and answer the questions that follow
 - e. Apply for Travel Coordination Permit (TCP)
 - f. Fill up required fields of the form and upload a photo of your ID, RTPCR Certificate and other documents as the case may be and click submit.
 - g. Wait for the approval of your S-Pass TCP by checking yours-Pass Account. To facilitate faster approval of your TCP, send a copy of your pending TCP to aklantraveller@gmail.com.

SECTION 8. PROVISIONS ON PUBLIC AND PRIVATE TRANSPORTATION.

Public and Private Transportation shall still be allowed subject to the following restrictions, to wit:

1. Motorcycle – subject to the regulation implemented by their respective LGUs
2. Tricycle – three (3) passengers including the driver
3. Multicab – 50% of the seating capacity
4. Jeepney – 50% of the seating capacity
5. Commuter Van – seven (7) passengers excluding the driver
6. Local Minibus – 50% of the seating capacity
7. Regular bus, shuttle bus & tourist bus – 50% of seating capacity
8. Private vehicles (sedan, pick-up and SUVs) – three (3) passengers excluding the driver
9. Motorbanca and other seacrafts catering to passengers – 50% of the seating capacity.

Public transport operators/drivers are mandated NOT to board persons with **NO** Facemasks and Face shields, otherwise, the operator/driver and the passenger shall be imposed an administrative fine provided for in a local ordinance of the place where the violation is apprehended.

SECTION 9. BORDER MANAGEMENT.

- A. Inter-Provincial Border Control** shall be managed by the Provincial Government.
- B. Inter-Municipal Border Control.** Non-essential travellers going to another municipality shall secure a **TRAVEL PASS** from the Office of the Municipal Mayor which shall be his entry pass to the municipality of destination subject to the limitations as to the number of persons allowed by the latter.
- C. Inter-Barangay Movement.** Non-essential travellers shall secure a **QUARANTINE PASS** from the barangay of his resident before he is allowed to cross border to another barangay.

Only **ONE (1) TRAVEL/QUARANTINE PASS** shall be issued for each family/household.

D. Vaccination Roll-Out. With the on-going vaccination roll-out, the movement of persons going to and from the vaccination site shall be unhampered, Provided they can show proof of their scheduled vaccination.

SECTION 10. EFFECTIVITY. The effectivity of this **ORDER** will be from August 1, 2021 to August 15, 2021 unless otherwise shortened or extended.
