- 3. Cadet Scout Gabriella Peñalosa (Infant Jesus Academy) and Cadet Scout Eunice Grace Jera (Regional Science HS for Region 6) will be the representatives to the said event. Camp registration fee, Meals, accommodation, transportation (bus & taxi fare) and other miscellaneous expenses incurred during the camp is free of charge.
- 4. It is understood that in the conduct of this event, as stated in the DO No. 66, s. 2017 (Implementing Guidelines on the conduct of Off-Campus Activities), all must observe the following:
 - Ensure relevance and alignment with educational competencies of the K to 12 curriculum and Leadership Development of Learners;
 - b) Uphold child protection principles and that no learners shall be disadvantaged in any form; and
 - Observe the safety and security protocols for all the participants before, during and after the activity.

We regret to inform you that due to Taal volcano eruption, the 2020 GSP International Camp which was scheduled on February 18-21, 2020 at Camp N, Nuvali, Sta. Rosa, Laguna has to be postponed and be rescheduled on December 1-6, 2020. Venue will be announced later.

The continuous spew of ashes of the Taal volcano and occasional tremors can be dangerous to the campers. Therefore, the GSP Management and National Program Committee decided to postpone the event, for the health and safety of everyone must always be the top priority. We tried to look for alternative venue, but would not be possible at such short notice.

In celebration of GSP's 80th Anniversary, we are pleased to inform you that the National Headquarters will hold "2020 GSP International Camp" with the theme "Girl Scouts Thrive in Diversity, Equality, and Inclusion (DEI)" on February 18-21, 2020 in Camp N, Nuvali, Brgy. Canlubang, Calamba City, Laguna.

PARTICIPANTS

- 30 Senior/Cadet Girl Scouts per Region (a total of 180 girls from the six Regions)
- 120 international campers from the WAGGGS Asia Pacific Region Member Organizations

A total of 300 campers are expected to participate in the camp.

QUALIFICATIONS OF PARTICIPANTS

- 1. Must be a registered Senior/Cadet Girl Scout as of February 2020.
- 2. Must be physically fit and alert.
- Must have earned at least two badges each under the 8-Point Challenge.
- 4. Must have attended any council/regional/national camp prior to this camp.
- 5. Must be a Patrol Leader's Camp Permit Course Certificate Holder.

TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION

Campers who are coming via air travel are advised to book their flights to Manila on or before noontime of February 17, 2020, Monday; and return flight not earlier than February 21, 2020, Friday night to give ample time for your land travel going to the airport.

Participants may check flight options via Ninoy Aquino International Airport which is 1-hour drive to Camp N, Nuvali, Brgy. Canlubang, Calamba City, Laguna.

You may avail the transportation service from NHQ to Campsite and vice versa at P1,000.00 per camper. Kindly accomplish the attached travel data sheet and deposit transportation fee to GSP NHQ before the deadline on <u>December 31, 2019</u>.

ARRIVAL IN CAMP

- a. The campers are expected to arrive in camp in the morning of Tuesday, February 18.

 No camper should arrive at the campsite earlier than the specified date of arrival.
- b. Upon arrival, the campers shall proceed to the Camp Registration Area to inform the Business Manager of their arrival. Please bring proof payment of your registration (deposit slip or approved PTDG form).

THINGS TO BRING

These should be brought by the individual camper and packed in a **duffle bag and a backpack/knapsack** provided with luggage tags. <u>Travel Luggage and/or Trolley Bags (Maleta) will not be allowed inside the camp.</u> Campers are encouraged to travel light, and bring only what is needed.

FOOD MANAGEMENT

The food of the campers is included in the registration fee.

The first meal to be served by the patrol in camp is breakfast on February 18, and last meal will be afternoon snacks on February 21.

TENTS

Campers should bring their own patrol sleeping tents (preferably dome tent that is big enough to a patrol of 8 girls) and ply tents.

PAYMENT OF REGISTRATION FEES OF CAMPERS

a. The camp fee is Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) per camper inclusive of food, program materials, camp souvenirs, group insurance, and transportation during offsite activities.

Please send through email your deposit slip to Finance Division at email address finance@girlscouts.org.ph and copy furnish the Program Division at email address program@girlscouts.org.ph . Paid registration fees of campers who were not able to attend are non-refundable.

b. Campers who wish to charge their fees to Program and Training Development Grant (PTDG) Fund, should seek the approval from their Councils and Regions. Councils/Regions should deposit the total amount to the account stated above. National Headquarters will only accommodate the confirmed campers who complied with the submission of forms and registration fees on or before the deadline.

Please note that campers will be awarded the badges and certificates only upon successful completion of the whole duration of the camp.

CHARGING OF ELECTRONIC DIVICES

Please be informed that the electrical power supply in the camp may not be sufficient to accommodate all the charging of campers' electronic devices. Hence, campers are advised to bring fully charged power banks. Tablets and laptops will not be accommodated for charging. The Camp Staff will give instruction for charging services.

CHAPERONES

All official chaperones of the campers must be Senior/Cadet Troop Leaders. A maximum of five (5) official chaperones per Region are allowed.

We expect to receive at the National Headquarters the accomplished forms (see attachment) not later than <u>December 15, 2019.</u>

Other details of the event will be included in the succeeding circulars. Meanwhile, we suggest that campers be screened and given the needed preparation during the pre-camp training.
